- 5.1 Zoning Amendment Bylaw No 813 (600-86), 2021 2021 2614 Otter Point Road -Third Reading to the Rezoning amendment
- 2.1 hectares lot to be reasoned from RRU 4 to RRU 5 to allow for the addition of 4 lots to make a total of 5 lots
- Developer to give \$12,000 in cash instead of 15% land, improve BC Transit bus stop
- Property owner adjoining subdivision has asked for a fence
- Discussion about the beautiful trees on the property
- It was noted that it is too bad the Tree Bylaw isn't complete
- Some disagreement if trees are old or low value second growth trees
- Also noted the subdivision was not in line with the new OCP as outside sewer boundaries but did comply with the one that is in effect at the moment
- Public Input William Wallace called in and spoke against the subdivision saying that it will add to Sooke's carbon and is not aligned with the new OCP
- Cllr. Beddows meets green lens
- Cllr. LaJeunese concern about the dangers of leaving trees
- Cllr. Logins disappointed that there is no Tree Protection Bylaw and updated OCP not in place
- Mayor Tait satisfied with staff's rational

- 5.2 Development Variance Permit 7044 Maple Park Terrace
- staff to work with applicant to develop variance to achieve a transition from 15% to 12% road grade for the portion of Brailsford Place and return to Council for further consideration of the variance request
- really a lot of discussion on this one after hours of discussion the motion was changed that staff would work with the applicant to see if portions of the road could stay at 15% and if any needed to be torn up and reconstruction

- Motion passed unanimously
- 5.3 Development Variance Permit 2340 Sun River Way
- reduce natural boundary setback to a watercourse from 30 metres to 11.6 metres for purpose of permitting the construction of an addition to an existing Community Care Facility (Daycare Centre).
- noted by the Mayor Tait that the daycare is a necessary part of the community

- public input concern about if there is an unusual weather event the water could rise and cause flooding and also that the map did not correctly show the stream
- Mayor Tait said there is a report done by the Province that shows stream flow and the variance meets Provincial requirements. The PDF is available on the District website
