- Welcome and Land Acknowledgement
- Agenda Review: no new items
- Treasurer's Report. Lily presented a corrected version of April 10, 2024
 Treasurer's Report along with the May 8 report. Moved/Seconded: Lily/John: "to accept the corrected version of April 10, 2024 Treasurer's Report to replace for report previously accepted by the April 10, 2024 meeting; and to accept the Treasurer's Report for May 8, 2024." - Action Items Arising from previous meeting:
 - Changing locale and dates for Transition Sooke Monthly meetings. We had previously agreed that we preferred meeting at Sooke Harbourside Co-Housing instead of the library. Unfortunately, Harbourside is not available on the second Wed. of each month. After a quick survey, we agreed to change our meeting date to 2nd Thursday for June and July. Our next meetings will be June 13 and July 11 at Harbourside. Transition Sooke will not be meeting in August. Fall dates will be confirmed at a later date. We will pass the hat around for donations at each meeting to cover the rental fees for Harbourside.
 - Speakers for monthly meetings. We developed a short list of potential speakers. The facilitator for each month's meeting will be responsible for liaising with the guest speaker.
 - Table at Earth Day. A successful event. Many people dropped by. Lots of signatures to our ZCSC petition (Doris did a stellar job getting people to sign!) Still some confusion about our name—people asking what we are "transitioning to". We need an "elevator speech" that will succinctly describe what we are about... eg transitioning from "x" to "x".

Action Group Reports

• Sustainable Food Security and Agriculture Group. Presentation by Sooke Community Garden group to the Committee of the Whole (Sooke District Council) was well-received. The Council asked District staff to work on a report to present to a future Council meeting for decision (hopefully in June). Sooke News Mirror wrote an article on the community garden. We are not sure why the newspaper chose a photo of Councillor Kevin Pearson to illustrate their article! The article ended with Pearson's assertion that it would be better to look for private land to build the community garden. Susan B offered to write a letter to the editor to rebut Pearson's suggestion.

- Zero Waste Sooke. The offer to set up a "dishes loan cupboard" for dishes
 to be made available for groups meeting in the library will be taken by the
 library staff to their management for decision. Gardening supplies, plants
 and tool Swap will be held this coming Sunday. Date for next Repair Café
 to be set. Updated website will be up and running soon. (ZWS website
 postings will be forwarded to Alan for posting on TS's website.)
- Climate Strategy Group. Petitions are being signed. Bookings made for pop-up table at both shopping malls. Work underway to set up an on-line petition. EMCS Principle on-side, will take petition to future staff meeting. Keifer is working on an article to explain the deeper connections and implications of Sooke's goal of lowering GHGs and the ZCSC.
